

## [January 2022]

Having staged two successful races in 2021, the Namib Race in Nambia and RacingThePlanet: Georgia, our race schedule for 2022 is currently set to go ahead as planned.

The health and safety of our participants, our volunteers, our medical teams, and our local and international staff are always our primary concern. We continue to monitor the guidelines from the World Health Organisation (WHO), the CDC and relevant government and medical authorities.

Although the nature of our races is a relatively small group of people running or walking in the outdoors, taking people to the lesser-visited corners of the planet to explore in a way that is not normally possible, there are still a number of changes that have been implemented to make each race even more COVID-19 safe. These new procedures are published specifically for each race.

We do understand that each person's situation is different and that some of you may prefer, or need, to register later than what is normally required or defer your race entry at the last minute. For this reason, we are happy for you to transfer your entry to another race at any time, including right up until six weeks before the race is due to go ahead for any race in 2022 or 2023. This does not apply to The Last Desert in Antarctica.

As long as it is logistically and safely possible, all races in 2022 are planned to go ahead as scheduled.
